to upkeep their properties and making things neat and tidy. It takes everyone in the community doing their part to keep up our relatively large subdivision. Keep it up! All of our

property values go up as a result.

So now for the not so nice part of this month's message. SLOW DOWN!!! Nearly every village is reporting that people are driving too fast. With the time change it's getting darker earlier and many of us will be outside later in the day, especially with how nice the weather is. You will feel terrible if you hurt someone with your car because you were in too much of a hurry or were distracted while driving. The HOA is working with Pasco County and the CDD to get some additional speed enforcement actions inside our gates.
