


NEWS by Nancy Intini, Operation Manager













I thought I would update you on some of the new projects the board has voted on for this year.

The front entry landscaping will get an update, Brenford, Weymouth Strathmore entrances will be getting a landscape update, the clubhouse will be kitchen cabinets, new sidewalks will be worked on for trip hazards. We ask that you PLEASE remove your tree to avoid further cost of maintaining the sidewalks. In the last three years we have spent well over \$200,00. In repairs due to the tree root lifting sidewalks.

We are installing two new flagpoles at the clubhouse to honor our Military and Essential workers. In addition, we will be installing a monument to honor our fallen soldiers. 

Despite owning the wall, the CDD refused to paint the interior side of the wall because they didn't have contiguous, uninterrupted access to the utility easement behind these homes. The Weymouth HOA is unwilling to paint the interior side of wall because it doesn't belong to them. So, we were at an impasse. Great news! As the time that this article

was being written, the CDD is considering a compromise solution. If the proposal is the CDD will adopted, purchase the paint and residents of Weymouth will provide the labor to paint the

Members of the CDD recently performed a safety inspection of our sidewalks. They identified tripping hazards and have marked them for future repair or replacement. An orange line indicates that the concrete will be ground down. An X indicates a section of the sidewalk that will be replaced. Tree roots under these sections will be removed before new concrete is poured. I don't have a timeline on the repairs yet, but I'll keep you posted as things develop.

I was reviewing our contract with our landscaping vendor. The Function Frequency Chart can be found on page 10 of our 13-page contract. According to the chart, the following services are to be provided in February:

- Four service visits
- Mowing, string trim, hard edging, soft edging, backpack blowing
- St. Augustine fertilization
- Pruning of shrubs
- Pruning the trees to 8'to 10' over walkways and 15' over the street
- Pruning 50 palm trees

Oakstead MASTER HOA by Jeff Conran

It's hard to believe that we are already two months into 2023. It seems like only yesterday we were planning for 2022 and hoping it would be better than 2021. I'm hopeful that with the new year, you've taken the opportunity to reflect on the previous years and are working towards making yourself and those around you better. In this vein (and that of my last note), let's discuss, briefly, some changes coming to our little piece of paradise. First and foremost, Oakstead Homeowner's Association has had the same management company (Associa Gulf Coast) since 2005 (it was originally Rampart, but they were bought out by Associa). They have served us well for the last 17 or so years, but the time has come for us to make a change. I won't bore you all with the details of association management, but the bottom line is that Associa and Oasktead were no longer a good fit for each other. Over the last few months, your board of directors has been interviewing companies and consulting with other experienced entities in the industry. After extensive research and weighing the costs involved, as well as the quality of the product available, we've decided to transition to Greenacre Properties Inc for our association management services. transition will happen at the end of February/early March.

So as a homeowner or resident in the Oakstead community, what does this mean for you? For the most part, it will be largely transparent to you and there won't be much change. The violation letters and covenant enforcement actions will come from the new company, and you're likely to see them much sooner than you have been, especially in recent months. The community manager (also known as our CAM) will change, as will the phone numbers you call to get support, and where to send your architectural review documents. Otherwise, things won't look much

different. I would ask that as we make this transition, please be patient. Since we've been working with Associa for nearly 20 years, you can imagine there are LOTS of files to transition, as well as making changes to our bank accounts, insurance policies, tax documents, etc. While I know Greenacre Properties Inc will do its absolute best to make the transition as seamless as possible, with nearly 1200 residences, and almost two decades of history, things are sure to be bumpy at the start. Again, I ask for your patience as we make this change.

Thank you for being part of this great community. We're looking forward to a wonderful 2023!
